

How to Prepare for Your Design Consultation

Your Floor Factors in-house design consultant looks forward to meeting with you. Review this checklist for an idea of what to bring and how to prepare.

✓ Ideas and Goals

Before your initial consultation, type up your ideas, goals, needs, wants, priorities, and vision—even if your vision is currently foggy. Sending this summary to your design consultant will help them make personalized suggestions.

✓ Visual Inspiration

Create a [Pinterest board](#), browse our [online gallery](#), and take photos of styles you like. If possible, send your inspiration to your design consultant before the meeting. You can bring physical samples of textures and colors that catch your eye too.

✓ Dimensions and Floor Plans

If you have floor plans for your home, that's great! However, they're not always to scale, so it's good to measure (and re-measure) to get accurate dimensions.

✓ Pictures of Your Home

Send your consultant pictures of your home prior to the appointment. This can give them an idea of your style and help them prepare.

✓ Budget

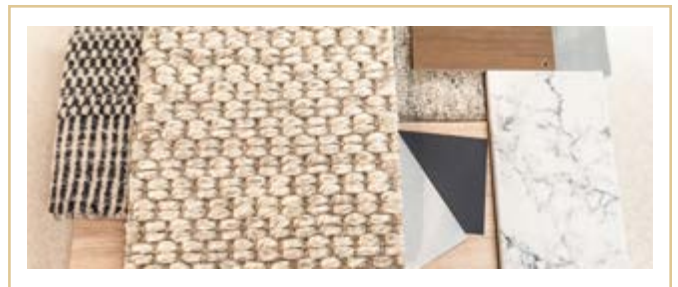
You should send your budget to your design consultant before meeting with them, even if it's not set in stone yet. This helps narrow down design possibilities and material options.

✓ Timeline

Be sure to communicate with your design consultant about your preferred schedule, as well as any strict deadlines.

✓ Questions
